About Heather and Jeff

Heather has been quilting for over 15 years and had a classic 22 Innova Longarm in the basement that she used for personal quilts. When the Innova Dealers retired at the end of December 2019, Heather asked Jeff if this would be something he would be interested in exploring.





November 9, 2022 (cont) Buy the Bolt

Although they started communicating with ABM (Innova) in February 2020, they delayed starting Buy the Bolt until August of 2020 because of the pandemic. They started Buy the Bolt in a small, cramped space on Woolwich Street and despite the ongoing pandemic the business continued to grow, and they soon realized that they needed a larger space. In January of 2022 they moved to their current space on Woodlawn Road. Buy the Bolt sells and services Innova Longarm Quilting Machines, carries quilting cottons, wide backs, flannels, Art Gallery Fabrics, Fireside, some pre-cuts, batting, longarm quilting thread, and Silly Moon Quilting Rulers.



Please note this presentation IS NOT INTENDED AS A SALES PITCH FOR INNOVA, BUT MERELY AN INFORMATION SESSION ABOUT LONG ARM QUILTING. The focus will be on learning more about the machines and how they work and what we as quilters can do to make sure our quilt sandwiches are prepared properly to send out to a long armer.

January 11, 2023 ~ Kim Caskey (cont)

Five countries participated in this World Wide Whispers project, Team Scotland, Team Ireland, Team Netherlands, Team USA and Team Canada. Each team started with the leader of their country (me for Team Canada), using an original photo as inspiration to create their piece, then photographing that finished piece, and sending that photo and artist statement to the next person on the team. That next team member then used that photo as their inspiration to create a piece, photographs it and sent it along to the next person, and so on and so on.

Team Canada is comprised of 13 members, a representative from each province and territory. The completed collection has been presented and exhibited around the world. Kim will introduce you to each artist and their unique piece of this magnificent team project.



February 8, 2023 ~ Dresden Quilt Blocks Made Modern with Candyce Copp Grisham

Zoom Presentation



My original goal was to create Dresden blocks by machine with as many different edge treatments as possible, including the straight, pointed, curved, and three-sided variations. What happened was an explosion of blocks in different edges, fabrics, and designs — a modern translation of a traditional block.

Layouts made the design appear both unique and contemporary. The color combinations were endless, and each new plate was a thrill. I started mixing the edges, making pieced strips to cut apart, adding fun centers, layering the plates, and overlapping the edges. Eventually, I appliquéd my first Dresden block to a pieced background and the result became the basis for my Dresden explorations and teaching.
