
## THE GRAND QUILT GUILD ROW BY ROW PROJECT 2024 – 2025 BLOCK # 6 March 12, 2025 Due April 9, 2025 MAPLE LEAF BLOCK



I am feeling the need for a little Canadiana, not sure why!! So here is a very simple Maple Leaf block.

You can make this all red if you wish, green or any autumnal colours. The choice is yours.

Fabric Requirements:

Scraps of fall colours, red, brown, orange, yellow, green for stem

You can make these leaves as bright or as multi coloured as your stash allows.

Instructions are given for 1 block, although if you wished, 4 HST could be made in the same fashion as described in the Churn Dash block and then distributed throughout the other leaf blocks.

BKG Fabric:

- 1  $2\frac{1}{2}$  " square
- 1  $2\frac{3}{4}$  " squares cut diagonally to make 2 triangles (stem block)
- 1 4" square (for HST)

LEAF :

3 x 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> " squares (all 1 colour or 3 different colour)


1 x 4 inch square (to make 4 HST)

Stem: 1" " x 3 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> "




Assemble the block:

- Half square triangles (HST) make four (4) at a time:
- Place the two 4" squares right sides together (1 BKG & 1 Main)
- \*\*You may want to spray these squares with starch or sizing as they will be sewn on the bias.
- Stitch a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> " seam around the four sides



- Now cut the square diagonally from corner to corner to make 4 half square triangles (HST).
- Square each HST to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  "
- Press the seam towards the darker fabric.
- \*\*All seams are <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch unless otherwise stated.

To make just 2 (two) half square triangles, cut the BKG and leaf fabric into 3 inch squares, place right sides together and draw a line diagonally right down the middle of the block and stitch  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch on either side of the line



Now to make the stem block:


- Cut the 2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch background block in half diagonally
- Take your small strip of fabric for the stem and place it on one of the cut edges, right sides together, making sure it extends from the corners just a bit.
- Center it on the diagonal cut. Be careful not to stretch this cut. It is on the bias and can stretch easily.
- Put the other side of the square on the opposite side of the strip of fabric, matching centers and right sides together.
- Sew both seams with a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-inch seam allowance. Press.



✓ Now trim the block down to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches

## Now assemble the block:

 $\checkmark$  The block is assembled in 3 rows



Okay now make 6 more. Happy piecing.
